Synod 2023 - A worldwide listening process

A Synod is a worldwide gathering of Bishops (with other delegates and experts) to discuss and discern how the Church responds to a certain issue. The meaning of Synod of journeying together and those Bishops representing their country are called to bring the thoughts and hopes of the people they represent. The 2023 will not be responding to a particular issue, rather it will be reflecting how the nature or culture of the Church can be more synodal - a wider listening to the Holy Spirit speaking through all peoples.

We shall use this process to help our parish develop. Please do pray the prayer for the Church in general and our parish in particular. Many thanks for everyone's contributions and they have been noted. We have chosen two actions to focus on:

1) To form the parish into an evangelising parish by first catechising ourselves.

2) To develop local domestic church groups to help build community.

From the Parish Priest's Desk

Dear Faithful,

We have a **parish meeting on the 17th February, 7.00pm**. So that you can better participate, I should like to give you the main topics that will be presented.

- 1) Our Core Pillars: Liturgy; Formation and community. Community will provide our identity and unity. A fourth principle is stewardship which will provide functional support for the parish.
- 2) Parish Structure: The main backbone of the parish will be Parish Groups who coordinate various spheres: Liturgy; Formation and Evangelisation; Community Groups (e.g. Women's Group) which also provide pastoral support; Estate management and lastly, finance. These will represent all parishioners and be led by individual parish members. Each of the groups will have membership on the PPC whose job is to co-ordinate these groups, assist them and liaise with finance committee. So the PPC will move from f dealing with the multitude of parish issues to really overseeing the mission of the parish. Once or twice a year there will be a Parish AGM which will enable all the parish to assess our mission. (See post on website for visual structure)
- **3)** Formation of Domestic Church: As in Acts 2 much happened in homes; the idea is to create small local clusters to oversee the well being (both practical as well as spiritual) of the members. Also they will facilitate evangelisation and mission. Each group will be overseen by a parishioner who can liaise with the Parish Priest. This idea has the support of Bishop Patrick and I think will be very beneficial. It will help share the load of the parish priest. It is very important that co-responsibility is exercised by the laity with the parish priest.

5) Some practical consequences

- 1) It is proposed that the hall be refurbished and designated as a Parish Centre which can provide facilities that the parish groups will need. It should be decorated and equipped and be "homely". This would necessarily curtail the hiring out of the hall.
- 2) We need to re-think our Sundays to build community once more. Both to restart the very important social sphere as well as also considering catechesis/formation to be available.
- 3) To really work at unity. We are blessed to have such diverse groups in our parish and it is important that everyone feels valued and that they belong.

The main thing the Bishop wants us to ponder is how we move to be a mission-centred parish. Well formed in our own faith so that we can reach out and bring others into the fold. Change is always difficult and needs careful handling and it is important that you, the parishioners, feel that you can take ownership of this. It will also provide an opportunities for me to take general questions. God bless, Fr. Dominic

FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION

"Look, my daughter, at my Heart encircled by these thorns with which men pierce it at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You, at least, strive to console me, and so I announce: **I promise to assist at the hour of death with the grace necessary for salvation** all those who, with the intention of making reparation to me, will, on **the first Saturday of five consecutive months**, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the beads, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary."

Devotees of Fátima believe that the First Saturdays help to console the sorrows of God, Jesus, and the Virgin Mary for the sins against her Immaculate Heart.(See wikipedia article)

As a parish we shall make this journey together starting on the 1st Saturday in February, February 5th. Rosary at 9.00am followed by 15 mins for the meditation with mass following (probably will start 9.35) and confessions available. Please note that one can go to confession up to two weeks before or after to fulfil the condition.
