Synod 2023 - A worldwide listening process

A Synod is a worldwide gathering of Bishops (with other delegates and experts) to discuss and discern how the Church responds to a certain issue. The meaning of Synod of journeying together and those Bishops representing their country are called to bring the thoughts and hopes of the people they represent. The 2023 will not be responding to a particular issue, rather it will be reflecting how the nature or culture of the Church can be more synodal - a wider listening to the Holy Spirit speaking through all peoples.

We shall use this process to help our parish develop. Please do pray the prayer for the Church in general and our parish in particular. Many thanks for everyone's contributions and they have been noted. We have chosen two actions to focus on:

1) To form the parish into an evangelising parish by first catechising ourselves.

2) To develop local domestic church groups to help build community.

From the Parish Priest's Desk

Dear Faithful,

On Tuesday the Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter, Bishop Patrick is celebrating vespers at the Cathedral. This feast is a symbol of unity. We are all united as one church under the Pope. The Bishop also wants to celebrate the work being accomplished on the synodal path.

Last Thursday, we had a productive parish meeting to discuss our parish's own particular journey. I should like to pass onto you some of the important points. One theme that ties in with Tuesday's feast is the need to work at unity in the parish. Our parish is blessed with a wide variety of race, culture and language. I would like to quote from Fr. Alex's sermon:

"Today, nearly two centuries on from the time when this church was built, we have here in Boston a thriving, multi-ethnic Catholic community in which each can hear, in many cases in their own language, and for all in the lingua-franca of English, each can hear the wonderful works of God, the Gospel of the Resurrection. Once again, the Holy Spirit is among us, pushing and cajoling us to see what God is doing in Boston and how we can, if we will, become ready fellow-workers with him in the work of the Gospel.

Such times of change are never easy. They are challenging and they ask of us discernment, patience and generosity. But the great rallying point for all of us, as always, that which is the source and summit of the Christian life, is this, the Eucharist. Blessed are we, all of us, who are called to the supper of the Lamb. It is here that we find the true source of our unity."

Those that attended Thursday's meeting all strongly felt that it was time to start working at greater unity. Saint Mary's is one parish with different communities within it but as Fr. Alex pointed out the Eucharist draws us all together. Different communities rightly at times have the Eucharist celebrated in either their own rite (Syro-Malabar) or in their own language (Polish and Lithuanian). This means that there should be both a sharing in the governance of the parish and a sharing in the many tasks that a parish requires to fulfil its mission. If Saint Mary's is to fulfil her task of mission, she needs to be able to call upon a much wider base.

Another important discussion centred around making the hall a "Parish Centre" – mainly for parish use but available for hire to parishioners. It would become a true centre: re-decorated with facilities etc making it a comfortable place for groups etc and meetings. This will have some financial repercussions but is certainly manageable. There was general agreement too on this.

Thirdly, there was strong support for making Sunday a focus for parish life; not only the Liturgy but also catechesis and Sunday coffee etc in the hall. I personally think this is very important for developing our community and our identity. The need for general catechesis was also discussed. Alongside this was discussed the need for smaller communities in the parish on a local level that would help with support, social and missionary activity.

Lastly, there was general agreement on the re-structuring of the parish. To move forward we need to re-start parish groups that will take responsibility for different aspects of the parish. The Parish Council would then have a co-ordinating and supervisory role.

Please take time to reflect upon this and see me or Martyn if you have any comments. Wishing you every blessing for the weekend.
