Synod 2023 - A worldwide listening process

A Synod is a worldwide gathering of Bishops (with other delegates and experts) to discuss and discern how the Church responds to a certain issue. The meaning of Synod of journeying together and those Bishops representing their country are called to bring the thoughts and hopes of the people they represent. The 2023 will not be responding to a particular issue, rather it will be reflecting how the nature or culture of the Church can be more synodal - a wider listening to the Holy Spirit speaking through all peoples.

We shall use this process to help our parish develop. Please do pray the prayer for the Church in general and our parish in particular. Many thanks for everyone's contributions and they have been noted. We have chosen two actions to focus on:

1) To form the parish into an evangelising parish by first catechising ourselves.

2) To develop local domestic church groups to help build community.

From the Parish Priest's Desk

Dear Faithful,

Before the changes to the Liturgical Calendar, the Church used to set aside three weeks of preparation for Lent. Whilst, this is no longer the case, it is important that we do spend some time preparing for this great season when many graces are available as we prepare to approach the Paschal mysteries and the renewal of our baptismal vows.

This Sunday providentially marks ten weeks (an important number) until we celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday** (24th April). This Sunday, it can be argues, is the greatest of the year; for not only is it Easter Sunday but the font of mercy pours out in superabundance so that we can obtain not only remission for our sins but a total cancelling of the debt we owe for them. It has been called a "second baptism." So I would like to invite you on a journey with this great Sunday as its goal. To come to it in the words of that beautiful preface of Lent "with the joy of minds made pure, eagerly intent on prayer, and participating in the mysteries by which they have been reborn, they made be led to the fulness of grace that you bestow on your sons and daughters."

So we need to make Mercy - God's Mercy – the focus of our journey. What it is? How great it is? What price it cost? How do we respond?

The goal of any spiritual journey is to be made anew or come to a rebirth through conversion of the heart and a changing of ones life. This theme dominates the Lenten Liturgy. At the start it is good to have in mind certain principles that will aid us in this transformation and transfiguration. In the gospel today we have the beatitudes in the account given by Luke and the first beatitude is the most important and the gateway to all the others: "Blessed are the poor." Although Luke leaves out the phrase found in Matthew (in spirit), it is nevertheless understood.

What does this mean? Jesus is not referring only to material poverty – although that is also included – but to spiritual poverty. This is the foundation on which the spiritual life and our journey stands: that before God we are poor, totally dependant on his grace. The only thing in this life which we can call truly ours is our sins. This disposition can be seen in the story of the pharisee and the tax collector at prayer. Luke 18:9-14. The tax collector goes home justified (righteous in the eyes of God) because he was humble he realised his total poverty.

This disposition must be ongoing; a constant holding of ourselves in our profound nothingness before God; but totally trusting in his goodness and his desire to fill us with graces beyond our imagining. "Mature Christian freedom is my total availability and obedience to the will of the all-wise God......At the centre of our being we must remain poor and free and available to God, rather than barricade ourselves through habit to the approaches of God's ever-surprising grace." E.L-Merikakis Way of the Disciple p.29)

Lastly I recommend a great book to help you in this: "Consoling the Heart of Jesus" by Michael E Gaitley. I think you will find it an eye opener. God bless, Fr. Dominic
