

From the Parish Priest's Desk

Dear Faithful

Sometimes the mystery, the drama that we are involved can fill us with can fill us with feelings of inadequacy, trepidation and even fear. Even at times when we hear the word "God," we can just feel bewilderment. This can be added to because we can't access God – at least at the heart – by our emotions, thoughts, reflections etc (although these can help at times if they lead to conversation with God.) This can lead to either a paralysis when we just remain frozen before the mystery, or we decide simply not to approach "Him" in any intimacy – we keep our distance, living our lives and allowing "Him" to live his; we pray, come to mass but in essence our lives and his are like two tramlines stretching into the distance – they may appear to draw closer but it is in fact an optical illusion.

I believe that if we are honest many of us think this way. Why? There can be a number of causes: Whatever we do, nothing seems to change; we are not prepared to live our fully our Christian lives, so grace is blocked; we have believed the lie that God is fundamentally not to be trusted totally, so we always wish to remain in control.

THIS IS A FUNDAMENTAL PROBLEM that must be addressed otherwise we shall never live the fully Christian life of freedom and joy.

What must we do about it - how do we rectify this situation?

Firstly, don't let the problem put us off, God can solve everything – even our sinfulness and infidelity. Secondly, we have to fix firmly in our minds that God is good and we can only truly find fulfilment in him – as Peter said to Jesus (and I am paraphrasing and expanding the gospel passage):

"Lord I don't understand what you are about, I don't really understand what you are telling me. But I know that I don't have the solution to my life and my happiness and so contrary to what I may be thinking or feeling, I do know and believe that in you alone lies the answer. So I am going to stick by you even if everything in me and everybody else decides to part from you." Cf Jn 6:68) Jesus tells us at the last supper: "This eternal life to know you the one true God and him whom you have sent, Jesus Christ." (Jn 17:3)

ABOVE ALL: Let us remember he has CHOSEN me. We may not understand anything, we may not even want him, we may not know how we are going to approach him or how he can possibly change us BUT HE has chosen us. He has first loved us. This is something that has come home to me preparing the children for First Holy Communion. One worries – have I prepared them enough and/or in the right way? Will they continue to practice? Are they ready? Have my mistakes hindered their preparation? Now whilst it is important to try to get things right – in the end it is HIS encounter; He has chosen it from all eternity. And even if this happens to be their only encounter with Him, it is enough.

Finally, however, as I keep coming back to it because one must always keep coming back to it, **it is only in prayer that we are really able to undergo a profound transformation** - what could be termed a "second baptism" of the Holy Spirit, when something so profound changes in us that we can never look at anything in the same way again.

We must set aside time for God (Jaques Philippe has written a lovely book, called "Time for God.) It starts there TIME FOR GOD. Then we must persevere come what may – whether anything seems to be happening or not. PERSEVERE. What we say, how we approach it can help but it is secondary. Pray whatever you feel comfortable or feel called to pray. Chat informally or say the Our Father slowly but whatever you do keep yourself open to what God wants to do in you. Look at a picture for example the icon in the newsletter and allow that to help you.

TIME FOR GOD

PERSEVERE

BE OPEN

It really is as simply as that. The battle comes in just doing those things because if we persevere, we shall be transformed and that is the last thing the world, our own weak human flesh and the devil wants.

Let us entrust ourselves to the Blessed Virgin Mary – she wants us to be with her baby, Jesus, more than we do ourselves. Let us place ourselves under her protection and surrender everything to her. As the beautiful prayer of St Bernard (The Memorare) says: "Never was it know that anyone who entrusted themselves to your protection was left forsaken."

God bless, Fr. Dominic *Fiat!*
