From the Parish Priest's Desk....

Dear Faithful,

We read in Scripture: "but be holy in every department of your lives, for the one who has called you is himself holy. The scripture says: 'Be holy, for I am holy." (I Peter 1:16)

What is holiness? The biblical word is rich in meaning, it includes goodness, purity, being firm in resolution, and set aside (consecrated) to the service of God. The essential meaning, however, (and all other meanings come from this) is the pursuit of the supreme good, God. This means that a holy person is one who with all his heart, mind and strength sets their lives on God as their final end and greatest good. Therefore, in their lives all things are ordered to this end and nothing that hinders this end is allowed.

Now God's plan from the very beginning is for everything to be holy; that is, everything is set apart and consecrated to him. Either formally in the case of people, sacred objects and places or indirectly, as ordered to him. This is why we bless not only people but also objects – homes, cars, rings etc.

Our mission as "priests" given to us in baptism, is to complete this mission to sanctify everything so that everything even from the furthest planet to the smallest cell in our body renders to God the complete praise that is owed to him and which he had in mind when he created it.

Now God also wanted to dwell with us – as St John says in the prologue – to pitch his tent and live among us. Why? So that through his presence – most importantly – in the Blessed Sacrament, he can continue his work to sanctify us. In the beginning, creation was his temple, the place where he walked with Adam and Eve. Then during the exodus, his presence – shekinah – dwelt within the Holy of Holies; then under Solomon the temple is built where God took up his holy presence for the people.

But this all pointed to the supreme temple: Jesus Christ. No one expected such lavishness of God that he himself would through the incarnation literally live among us and continues to do so in every tabernacle throughout the world. But even this has an end that through this grace we become living temples of the trinity. What a destiny! What Divine Mercy! What Divine Condescension!

The crisis in the church, the world and the family is that we have lost site of this mission. As things lose their link to God, so they lose their moorings and the pursuit of the supreme good is substituted for by immediate human happiness. Liturgy becomes orientated towards the needs of man. Education becomes orientated to jobs and the demands of the state. The sacredness of the Church becomes undermined. We no longer have our houses, cars, etc blessed. Church teaching which by definition is the teaching of Christ and therefore, orientates us to our final end, is disobeyed if it interferes with our temporal happiness. The world has assigned the good to temporal things and has lost sight of its final end.

We need to RESTORE (restoration = redeeming) everything to its order, plan and purpose for which it was created and to rediscover our lost innocence. How?

- Knowing what we have lost
- Knowing how to restore it and realising in this lies our happiness, peace and joy.
- Avoiding Lukewarmness

One of the mysteries that God has built into our faith is that we can only discover the rewards once we have pledged ourselves. We cannot discover this joy and peace and love unless we are all in regardless of what this might bring.

This is why the Pentecostals and born again faiths have such staggering growth. They flow from the Holy Spirit and ask their followers for total commitment. Their faith is community. One of our mistakes, I believe, is that we don't ask enough of people.

This weekend as we celebrate the anniversary of the Dedication of our Church, let us pray for a renewal in our parish animated by the Holy Spirit. Let us pray too that by the end of our lives we have used up all our energy, totally spent in the service of God. Let us work at discovering the sense of what it means to be holy – what does it mean that a time is sacred time; that a place is a sacred place.

In this month of October let us ask Mary to intercede for us when we pray our daily rosary. God bless, Fr. Dominic.
