"The Father chose her in Christ before the creation of the world, so that she might be holy and immaculate before him in love, preordaining her as the first fruits of filial adoption through the work of Jesus Christ (cf Eph 1, 4-5). The predestination of Mary, like that of each one of us, is linked to the predestination of the Son. Christ is that "seed" that was "to bruise the head" of the ancient serpent, according to the Book of Genesis; he is the Lamb "without blemish" (cf Es 12, 5; 1 Pet 1, 19), immolated to redeem humanity from sin.

With a view to the saving death of the Son, Mary, his Mother, was preserved free from original sin and from every other sin. The victory of the new Adam also includes that of the new Eve, Mother of the redeemed. The Immaculate Virgin is thus a sign of hope for all the living who have triumphed over Satan by the blood of the Lamb (cf Apoc 12, 11).

Today let us contemplate the humble young girl of Nazareth, holy and blameless before God in love [charity], in that "love" [charity] whose original source is God himself, one and triune. How sublime an act of the Most Holy Trinity is the Immaculate Conception of the Mother of the Redeemer! Pius IX, in the Bull Ineffabilis Deus, recalls that the Almighty "by one and the same decree had established the origin of Mary and the Incarnation of divine Wisdom" (Pii IX Pontificis Maximi Acta, Pars prima, p559).

The "yes" of the Virgin to the announcement of the Angel fits into the reality of our earthly condition, with humble respect for the divine will to save humanity not from history but in history. Indeed, ever preserved free from all taint of original sin, the "new Eve" benefited uniquely from the work of Christ as the most perfect Mediator and Redeemer. The first to be redeemed by her Son, she shares to the full in his holiness; she is already what the entire Church desires and hopes to be. She is the eschatological icon of the Church."

From the Parish Priest's Desk....

Dear Faithful,

The Liturgy this weekend is very beautiful but also very arresting – it should make us stop in our tracks.

On the one hand, we see the great prophecy of Isaiah that the Messiah is going to be anointed with the Holy Spirit and is going to bring peace to the world. The evils brought about by original sin - which not only effected the human race but also the whole of creation, destroying even the unity of the natural world - are going to be healed; peace is going to return. In the second reading we see that this will apply now not only to the Jewish peoples but also to the gentiles. All is going to be restored and the promises of Abraham fulfilled.

On the other John the Baptist cries out that this necessitates a repentance – a turning back. Once we know who Jesus is and what he has come to do, we have no choice but to turn back, to throw off the old man and to put on a new. In Lent this repentance is accompanied by a deep sorrow for sin, in Advent it is more the joy of the child who is to be born that makes us rush to repent so that we shall be ready to greet him when he is born.

Repentance is a word that often has negative associations: difficulty, effort, giving up pleasures etc. But a true repentance should rather be a cause for great joy. Yes it will necessitate difficulties because we have to change but the joy is that what this will bring about in us is that we shall become our true selves, we shall have true peace which the world cannot give and which sets us free in Christ with a true freedom which once experienced is never forgotten. But this itself necessitates a true knowledge of ourselves. Often we simply don't realise how much we are in need of repentance and cleansing.

Let us pray to Mary, pregnant with Jesus, to intercede for us this Advent, that we are ready for Christmas with hearts and minds made new. God bless, Fr. Dominic
