- **RENOVATION WORK:** We have received 4 bids for the renovation/restoration work on the Church and Old School house and the PPC will be meeting with the architect to study them and decide. We have decided that all the works should be undertaken even if that requires a loan from the diocese. This will require some fundraising work in the parish and perhaps we need a team dedicated to planning for this.
- **MISSION TEAM:** The Bishop has asked that every parish prepare a plan for mission and that either he or the Vicars General will be visiting each parish after Easter. - **BICENTENARY PREPARATIONS:** We need to start discerning our preparations. If you have ideas or are willing to serve please see Fr or Deacon Martyn.
- **RENAMING OLD SCHOOL HOUSE:** The proposal at the moment is to call the "Old School House", the **St John Henry Newman Centre**. Any objections or different ideas please see Fr. This seems apt as he is now a Doctor of the Church.
- **DAILY MASSES:** Attendance seems stable regardless of the times but if you have a request please see Fr. I apologise that it has been difficult to get regular timings. But I am trying to keep: Tuesday 9.30am Wednesday 7.00am and Fridays 7.00pm. It is important that those that work also have an opportunity.
