- **RENOVATION WORK:** The final cost of the project including contingency fees will be £512,986. The shortfall from our current funds will be about £235 which will require a loan from the diocese. It has been agreed that we should go forward and complete all the work. The diocese will ensure that any loan will not put a too difficult burden on the parish. However, it will mean that we will be looking at grants and fundraising.

- **RENAMING OLD SCHOOL HOUSE:** The proposal at the moment is to call the "Old School House", the **St John Henry Newman Centre.** Any objections or different ideas please see Fr. This seems apt as he is now a Doctor of the Church.
